Baker Park is a 98-unit family development built on almost five acres which were purchased from San Jose's Moreland School District. The development, completed in 1995, consists of two-, three-, and four-bedroom townhouse-style

units built around a large central courtyard. Where possible, mature redwood trees on the site were preserved to maintain the site's parklike atmosphere. The site adjoins an elementary school and children can walk to school without crossing any streets.
