Pickering Place is an afforable housing community named after the historic Pickering House that sits at its entrance. MidPen Housing used the turn-of-thecentury Victorian home as a model for the community's units, incorporating

bay windows, eave brackets, hip roofs, and picket fences into the design. The units are housed in two- and three-story buildings that are arranged to create a series of open courtyards. In addition, the buildings feature porches, encouraging interaction among residents.
