Kottinger Gardens consists of the redevelopment of Kottinger Place and Pleasanton Gardens, two affordable housing properties for seniors that were revitalized and became one integrated affordable housing community conveniently located near bus lines, parks, and downtown amenities. Kottinger Gardens provides a total of 185 new affordable rental apartments, more than double the original amount. Completed in 2017, Phase I provides 131 new affordable homes which replaced old cottages with new cottagestyle apartments and new construction of an apartment building. Phase II

across the street was completed in 2019 and includes redevelopment of cottage-style apartments.

Kottinger Gardens is the result of thoughtful planning by the City of Pleasanton and the Kottinger Place Redevelopment Task Force. The Task Force and the City recognized the need for additional senior homes and planned for a way to

The Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) also played an important role through its approval to remove Kottinger Place from its public housing inventory, allowing the City and MidPen to construct twice as many new, energy-efficient, accessible homes.

Kottinger Gardens' design supports the goal of healthy living, allowing seniors to age in place and continue to live active and enriched lives. Kottinger Gardens includes: community gardens, a bocce ball court, community room, fitness room, and a lounge area with computers. All apartments have ample in-unit storage as well as private porches or balconies, giving residents access to stunning views.
