The development of **Moon Gate Plaza** forges a new and innovative path for permanent supportive housing on a site steeped in the cultural history of the City of Salinas. In 2012, the City and MidPen Housing formed a partnership to revitalize the historic Chinatown neighborhood in order to reinvigorate economic development and house the area's growing homeless population.

Through a groundbreaking collaboration between MidPen and

the Central California Alliance for Health, Moon Gate connects housing and health services for the highest utilizers of the healthcare system, with 20 supportive apartments set aside for that population. Another 20 apartments accept referrals from Interim, Inc., a leading provider of mental health and support. A robust services
