Golden Gate Avenue Phase 1, an affordable housing community with a preference for San Francisco Unified School District and San Francisco Community College District educators and employees, is the result of a thoughtful partnership with the San Francisco Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development and the State of California. Previously a surface parking lot used for state employee parking, the site will be redeveloped into high-quality housing for local workers in close proximity to schools, parks, retail, employment opportunities, and public transit connections. State employee parking will be preserved in a semisubterranean ground floor garage.

Construction on the community is scheduled to begin in winter 2024 and finish in winter 2026, with lease up taking place in 2027. Phase 1 will serve a broad range of income levels, including households and individuals making up to 120% of San Francisco Area Median Income.

A second residential development, Golden Gate Avenue Phase 2, will include a similar adjacent building with approximately 96 residential units serving low-income households. Phase 2 will be completed in the future and is not currently anticipated to include a preference for School or Community College district staff.
