As the result of an innovative collaboration with faith-based and private business sector partners, **Immanuel-Sobrato Community** responds to the need for housing for chronically unhoused individuals by providing 108 new affordable apartment homes and supportive, wrap-around case management services in the Rose Glen neighborhood of San José.

In early 2018, Immanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church (IELC) of San José and its congregation approached MidPen about a partnership to build affordable housing on the northern portion

of their underutilized campus, with the goals of revitalizing the physical condition of the property and reinvigorating the spiritual mission of the Church and its community service efforts. Two years after these initial conversations, the

community was entitled utilizing a streamlined ministerial approval process under California Senate Bill 35. Construction on Immanuel-Sobrato Community began summer 2021 and welcomed residents summer 2023.

Resident amenities include a community room with kitchen, fitness room, office spaces for property management, resident services, laundry facilities, and a private outdoor recreation area.
